

### What is SOAP?

SOAP is a handy Bible study template centred around Scripture, Observation, Application and Prayer; all designed to take you deeper into God's Word. It works like this:

SCRIPTURE - simply pick a passage and read it.

**OBSERVATION** - to go deeper ask yourself: what does the passage say about God? About us? What's happening? Who's involved? Where is it happening? Anything else you notice?

APPLICATION - we don't just read God's Word to learn, but also to live. Write down one personal and/or practical way you could practise something you have observed from the passage in your everyday life.

**PRAYER -** lastly pray. Take a moment to write a prayer, giving thanks to God for his Word and what he has revealed to you. Ask for his help to live it out in your life.

Why not give it a go in this short book as we take a look at 11 Psalms that featured on our social media Psalms series in May 2020?

PSALM 23:6





### Scripture

Read Psalm 23

### **Observe**

What does Psalm 23 teach you about God? And what does that mean for you and others? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Lie down, be still and let the truth of what you have just read fill your heart.

### **Pray**

Thank God for his presence and guidance. Ask for his grace to sustain you through life's journey.



## The LORD has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations.

PSALM 98:2







### Scripture

Read Psalm 98

### **Observe**

Make a list of what this Psalm says about God and what he has done. Which stands out to you most?

Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Spend some time listening to worship music and imagine what it will be like when he returns.

### **Pray**

Thank God for Jesus. Ask for his help to live a life that glorifies him everyday, everywhere and in front of everyone.



### Come and see what God has done, his awesome deeds for mankind!

PSALM 66:5







### Scripture

Read Psalm 66

### **Observe**

What is glorious praise (v.2)? Why does the author praise God for letting so many hard things happen to him and the people of God? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Have a go at writing your own psalm of thanksgiving, remembering God's love in your life.

### **Pray**

Praise God for his character and actions. Ask for his help to turn from sin and be refined for your growth and his glory.



### But the plans of the LORD stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations.

PSALM 33:11







### Scripture

Read Psalm 33

### **Observe**

What stands out to you about God's nature? How does this give you hope today, like the psalmist? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Go to a place with no distractions. Be still, rejoice and rest in God's gaze upon you today.

### **Pray**

Thank God that he is worthy of all praise. Ask for his help to live your life dependent on him, resisting the urge to put hope in yourself.



### Worship the LORD in the splendour of his holiness: tremble before him all the earth.

PSALM 96:9







### Scripture

Read Psalm 96

### **Observe**

What makes our God great and worthy of all praise? How will creation react to God's final coming (v.11-13)? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

We have good news to share! How can you go into the world to serve, love and show this today?

### **Pray**

Pray for God to grow his grace in you as well as an even greater sense of boldness to make Jesus known in these days.


As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for for God, the living God. When can I go and meet with God?

### Scripture

Read Psalm 47

### **Observe**

What do you notice about God's Kingship in this psalm? What does v.9 tell you about who will be included in God's Kingdom? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Think about how God has saved you and write your own 60 second spoken testimony to share.

### **Pray**

Look at a map and pray for 5 nations around the world to realise the grace of God in their lives.



## He remembers his covenant forever, the promise he made, for a thousand generations.

PSALM 105:8





### Scripture

Read Psalm 105

### **Observe**

What do each of the stories recounted - Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses and Aaron teach you about God and humanity? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Create a rainbow and display it somewhere you can see it as a reminder that God keeps his promises.

### **Pray**

Thank God that he is the sovereign One who saves you. Praise him for the eternal home he is preparing for you.



# Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his: we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

PSALM 100:3





### Scripture

Read Psalm 100

### **Observe**

Why should you offer yourself to God? How do you do this and what should it look like in your daily life? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Take time throughout the day to speak the words of v.3 out loud over yourself.

### **Pray**

Ask that God will grant you the delight of obeying him so that you will come to resemble him more and more as you live.

# [The LORD] he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities

PSALM 103:10







### Scripture

Read Psalm 103

### **Observe**

What does this psalm teach you about God's character: his love, forgiveness, satisfaction, anger, compassion, salvation and reign? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Gaze up at the sky and allow the imagery of his infinite love for you conveyed by infinite distances lead you in worship today.

### **Pray**

Thank God for his love. Praise him that he doesn't just pardon our sin, but adopts us into his family.

The whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders: where morning dawns, where evening fades, you call forth songs of joy.

PSALM 65:8







### Scripture

Read Psalm 65

### **Observe**

What might some of the "good things of your house" (v.4) be? How does God care for his world (v.9-13) and what might this mean for you and others? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

How can you show love for all and especially care for people who are far from you socially, economically, racially or politically?

### **Pray**

Praise God that his salvation is global and that he is alive, moving and at work in hearts and lives all over the world.



### Let everything that has breath praise the LORD. Praise the LORD.

PSALM 150:6







### Scripture

Read Psalm 150

### **Observe**

How does Psalm 150 give you a glimpse of the eternal future that awaits you? Note down anything else that stands out to you.

### **Apply**

Today, try to praise God everywhere you find yourself (v.1), for everything you see and have (v.2), and in every way you can (v.3-5).

### **Pray**

Thank God for all he has given you throughout your life. Ask that he grant you one thing more: a heart for praising him.



Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose life does not wither - whatever they do prospers.
